
Johnston iJAG (Iowa Jobs for America's Graduates) at Johnston High School is putting

American Legion Veterans Day Plaque presented to Urbandale High School in 1954 "lost" since 1977 - Found!





1916-1952 The first
Urbandale school
Buildings built at the

70th street and Douglas site. A new brick, three-story school building was constructed in



1925, after the wood frame two-room building was moved nearer to Monroe Court. In 1954 the school proposed to replace the original roof mounted flag pole to a new location near the front door of the school. The Urbandale Legion Post 663, in honor of Veterans Day, presented a plaque to the Urbandale High School to be installed at the base of the new flag pole. In 1977, the facilities were demolished and the land was sold This site is now a Walgreen's Drugstore.

The plaque was recently discovered in a rubble pile at the north end of the Urbandale High School. The plaque will be installed along with the original school flag pole on the Urbandale Historical Society property at Airline & 70th Street.
