Urbandale Parks and Recreation has contacted Legion Post 663 about this project that was "put on hold" during the pandemic. It appears that Urbandale, as well as Polk County Supervisors, have expressed interest in pursuing this project, with conditions as required by Polk County's approved development artist.



It was suggested that applying for a grant of up to \$5000, was not out of line for this type of project. Other grant sources and fundraising could be used for additional funding.

Other possible projects may include a "Freedom /Veteran/Memorial " boulder on the grassy median to the east of the front door or, on the west side near the storage building – it would have a flag and spot light.
